Dredging - needed more than ever

- Last dredging was done in the 1980's
- Sediment has been building up on average at a rate of 3000 cubic yards/year
- The floods in 2018 dramatically impacted the lake
 - An additional 67,340 cubic yards deposited in the bays compared to 2015 (Based on sediment surveys in 2015 and 2018)

Efforts to minimize dredging costs


- Interviewed contractors after the 2018 bidding process Lessons learned
 - Why didn't they bid? How could we reduce cost?
- Six disposal sites made available Thank you landowners!
- Allow for hydraulic, mechanical, or combined dredging methods to be bid
- Allow a longer period of time to complete the project
 - Begin early summer 2019 or 2020 with completion by the end of 2020

Results

- Reduced estimated project cost over \$2 Million
 - 2018 estimate: \$6.5 Million
 - 2019 estimate: \$4.3 Million

What makes up the Dredging Project Cost?

- Contractor Bids
 Published on web site & in newspapers
- Contingency Component
 Accounts for unforeseen costs
 (additional dredged sediment)
- Loan Financing Cost
 Cost of borrowing money



Dredging Tax Levy

- The dredging tax levy currently assumes no other funding source and the full contingency is needed
- Tax levy applies for up to ten years
- The tax levy will be lowered based on any future funding that might become available

Project Component	Cost		
Contractor Bid	\$3.3 Million		
Contingency	\$400 Thousand		
Financing Cost	\$563 Thousand		
Tax Levy	\$4.263 Million		

Example using 2018 Assessed Valuation

Tax Levy for ten years	Annual tax increase for a \$100K property (for 10 years)	Annual tax increase for a \$300K property (for 10 years)
\$4.263 Million	\$182	\$547

Potential Project Cost Reductions

Reducing the Tax Levy

- Not spending the entire contingency
 - Reduction in construction cost (amount of sediment dredged)
- FEMA reimbursement for 2018 damage claim
- Wisconsin DNR channel grant
- State of Wisconsin relief
- Sauk County relief
- Town of LaValle relief
- Donations

Support Funding the Dredging Project

- Sauk County LRPD engaged with county officials regarding 2020 budget consideration. Feedback expected December 2019
- **State of Wisconsin** Met with Representative Kurtz. Raised awareness of the importance of the lake and recent damage from 2018 storms. The possibility of state support is being pursued. Feedback expected October 2019
- **DNR** Channel navigational grant. Re-apply in August 2019
- FEMA Requested financial aid from the public assistance program. Details on next slide

 The above funding can only be considered for committed projects
- Tax Levy Voting today to approve or not. Applies to all LRPD properties
- Private & Business Donations Program launch summer 2019

FEMA Dredging Relief

- If the LRPD claim is fully approved, we'd expect \$875,000
- Decision is expected late 2019
- Reimbursement over 2-3 years
- If the dredging resolution is not approved, we must withdraw our application for FEMA assistance
- This is our only opportunity for FEMA dredging assistance

The Proposed Dredging Plan

- Equipment mobilization: mid-June
- Mechanical dredging begins: the week after 4th of July
- Barges haul spoils to Mourning Dove LRPD lots for offloading to trucks.
- Spoils trucked to two off-lake sites
- Hours of operation: Monday to Friday 10 to 12 hours per day
 - Dredging operations suspended over July 4th & Labor Day weekends
- Planned completion: October 2019

Preparations For & Impacts When Dredging

- All piers, lifts, boats, platforms, water toys must be removed prior to the start of dredging in a bay until completion of operations in that bay
- There will be no water access to a bay where dredging is underway

We cannot delay

- Costs will only go up.
 - 2018 low bid contractor increased its bid by 26% for 2019
- Most funding sources require committed projects
- Only opportunity for FEMA dredging relief
- Protect property values
 - LRPD property assessments dropped 7% in 2018
 - Property assessments throughout Sauk County increased 3% in 2018
 - Real estate predictions documented last year are coming true

What happens after the vote?

YES VOTE

- LRPD enters into contracts with Kaiyuh Services/Water Works Marine
- LRPD secures loan
- LRPD pursues outside funding
- LRPD will work w/Kaiyuh Services, Water Works Marine, & Ayres to execute the project
- LRPD will raise the general tax levy for 2019 to begin loan repayment

NO VOTE

- LRPD residents need to decide whether to further pursue dredging, possibly at the August annual meeting
- A new committee would need to be formed
- Process starts over
- Earliest start for dredging likely 2023

Shall the Lake Redstone Protection District, Town of La Valle, Sauk County, Wisconsin, be authorized to:

- 1. Borrow pursuant to Chapter 33.31 of the Wisconsin Statutes in an amount not to exceed \$3,700,000 for the purpose of dredging sediment from up to 25 bays in Lake Redstone.
- 2. To levy an annual irrepealable tax against all taxable property within the Lake Redstone Protection District to pay the principal and interest of the indebtedness incurred, when due, for the above-referenced dredging. Tax to be levied based on <u>all</u> taxable property within the District includes, but is not limited to land and improvements.
- 3. Enter into contracts with lowest responsible bidder for completion of dredging project.
