Dear Lake Redstone Property Owner,

This letter is your invitation to attend the 50th Annual Meeting of the Lake Redstone Protection District (LRPD).

8:15 am- Doors will open; 9:00 am- Meeting begins

You must arrive before 9am to be eligible to vote.

A copy of the agenda is enclosed. The three items that require voting are: the commissioner election, the proposed budget for 2027 including the tax levy, and the four proposed changes to the LRPD By-Laws.

Because this is the 50th Anniversary, special attention is going to be given to the past actions and results of the LRPD, per its mission to “Maintain and enhance water quality.” Former commissioners are encouraged to attend. The list of past commissioners can be found on the LRPD website: lakeredstonepd.org. It is under the meetings/agenda tab/annual meetings. Click on the Commissioner History button.

Also enclosed is the 2026 budget proposal. State statute (Chapter 33.30) mandates that annual meeting voting must be done in person. Absentee ballots or proxies are not allowed. Each person wanting to vote will need to sign an affidavit affirming their eligibility to vote in District elections.

At this meeting two commissioners will be elected to the board. Biographies for the current candidates are enclosed. Any other District property owner wishing to be a candidate for the Board should send a biography to lrpdboard@gmail.com. Nominations will be accepted from the floor.

Another important issue on the agenda is a proposal for minor revisions to the district bylaws. A brief summary of the proposed changes along with the rationale for the changes is included in this mailing. The revised bylaws are available on the district’s website.

Please remember that the District’s charter is specific to matters regarding water quality. Topics such as zoning, rental properties, fishing regulations, and state boating regulations cannot be discussed.
